<p>Welcome & Introductions</p>	<p>Janine Logan, Nassau-Suffolk Hospital Council/Population Health Improvement Program (PHIP), welcomes Steering Committee members to the meeting. Four members are in attendance.</p>
<p>10-Week Extension of the Population Health Improvement Program</p>	<p>The PHIP has received funding from New York State for a ten week extension, bringing the end of the PHIP grant to March 31, 2020. The LIHC continues to advocate, and seek funding to exist beyond the March 2020 date.</p>
<p>Updating Legislators on LIHC Progress – Meeting on October 16th</p>	<p>Legislators restored funding to the statewide PHIP program in this year’s state budget and were on hand at the August collaborative meeting to see how the Long Island PHIP, known as the Long Island Health Collaborative, is coordinating population health activities for this region. Each legislator introduced themselves, the committees that they sit on, and which districts they serve.</p>

	<p>As each LIHC member introduced themselves, they had the opportunity to give a brief summary of their organization’s mission, and showcase their efforts and successes to the senators and assemblymen.</p> <p>Multiple legislators are expected to attend the October 16 meeting.</p>
<p>Walk Safe Long Island – Partnership with the New York Coalition for Transportation Safety</p>	<p>The LIHC has supported the pedestrian and traffic safety initiatives of the New York Coalition for Transportation Safety by implementing a multi-faceted awareness-raising campaign throughout Nassau and Suffolk Counties. This awareness campaign consisted of a public-facing website, digital outreach, educational cards, and a scholarship competition, among other strategies.</p> <p>The partners of Walk Safe Long Island have created a toolkit, <i>Long Island’s Pedestrian Safety Education Resource Guide</i>, to be a resource for those conducting pedestrian safety outreach and/or education programs on Long Island. The toolkit includes information on crash data, pedestrian safety laws, and handouts from existing programs.</p> <p>Toolkits are available to LIHC members by request.</p>
<p>Chronic Disease Self-Management Program with Community Engagement Network</p>	<p>Community Engagement Network, LLC, (CEN), a leading provider of chronic disease self-management programs, has partnered with NSHC to offer the CDSME to the Nassau and Suffolk communities in English and Spanish during the months of September through November 2019.</p> <p>CDSME is being offered in the counties of Nassau and Suffolk under the sponsorship of the Nassau-Suffolk Hospital Council (NSHC) and its Long Island Health Collaborative. NSHC and the Long Island Health Collaborative are absorbing all costs associated with the workshop series.</p>
