

CHNA/CHA Workgroup & NYS Prevention Agenda Updates

- Next 6-year cycle: 2025-2030
 - Most states moving away from disease-based priorities
 - Shifting toward an SDOH model
 - NYS 2 frameworks proposed:
 - Current format with added topic of SDOHs
 - Following Healthy People 2030 SDOH domains, strong emphasis on SDOH factors
- Ad Hoc Committee to Support the NYS Prevention Agenda (PA)
 - Consultation body for the PA
 - Survey sent to stakeholders in spring to inform prioritization/topics; findings to be presented at next Public Health and Planning Council (PHHPC) meeting held mid-April
 – June PHHPC meeting canceled
 - Finalized framework to follow; guidance for new cycle expected summer 2024
 - In December PHHPC will have its new action plan
 - Comprehensive 2025-2027 CHNA/CSP due December 31, 2025 for hospitals; corresponding documents (CHA/CHIP) for health departments due at same time
- More updates about the new PA and our Work Group meetings to come
- <u>NYS DOH CHNA/PA Guidance and Timetable through Dec. 2028</u>
